Munājāt Sha'bāniyyah (7) — Exhilaration in the Lord's Liqā'

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إِلْهِي جُودُكَ بَسَطَ أَمَلِي وَ عَفْوُكَ أَفْضَلُ مِنْ عَمَلِي

إِلَهِي فَسُرَّ نِي بِلِقَائِكَ يَوْمَ تَقْضِي فِيهِ بَيْنَ عِبَادِكَ

إِلْهِي اعْتِذَارِي إِلَيْكَ اعْتِذَارُ مَنْ لَمْ يَسْتَغْن عَنْ قَبُولِ عُذْرِهِ

فَاقْبَلْ عُذْرِي يَا أَكْرَمَ مَنِ اعْتَذَرَ إِلَيْهِ الْمُسِيئُونَ

إِلَهِي لاَ تَرْدَّ حَاجَتِي وَ لاَ تُخَيِّبُ طَمَعِي وَ لاَ تَقْطَعْ مِنْكَ رَجَائِي وَ أَمَلِي

إِلَهِي لَوْ أَرَدْتَ هَوَانِي لَمْ تَهْدِنِي وَ لَوْ أَرَدْتَ فَضِيحَتِي لَمْ تُعَافِنِي

إِلَهِي مَا أَظُنُّكَ تَرُدُّنِي فِي حَاجَةٍ قَدْ أَفْنَيْتُ عُمُرِي فِي طَلَبِهَا مِنْكَ

My God! Your Generosity has <u>increased my aspiration</u>, and Your Pardon is worthier than my action.

My God! So <u>make me exhilarated by Your Meeting</u> on the day wherein You will judge between Your Servants.

My God! My apology to You is the seeking excuse of someone who cannot afford the non-acceptance of his apology, thus accept my excuse, O the Most Honouring One that the sinners seek excuse from.

My God! <u>Don't turn</u> my request <u>down</u>, and <u>don't</u> <u>undermine</u> my yearning, and <u>don't cut off</u> my hope and aspirations from You.

My God! If You had wanted my disgrace, You would not have guided me, and if You had wanted to expose me, You would not have kept me well.

My God! I don't reckon You will turn down a request I have expended my whole life in seeking it from You.

The aspirations of a human are an indicator of his worthiness, and criteria of progress. The more a seeker seeks the Almighty, the sharper his vision becomes, and as a result the more nuanced and farreaching his aspiration becomes. Only in the case of God-centered aspirations, one sets their sights on seemingly conflicting goals — perfections unattainable since they are unlimited, and likewise attainable since they are received at the extant of the capacity of the soul's crucible, in perfect synchrony with the Divine Light. A wayfarer finds God's generosity to be a stimulant to seeking his aspirations and despite his actions falling short, relies on the Lord's Pardon to remove obstacles in moving towards those perfections¹ rather than relying on his own actions.

But what can be said about the **ultimate aspiration** – the $Liq\bar{a}$ ' $All\bar{a}h$ (the Meeting with God)! An aspiration which when reached leaves nothing but ecstatic exhilaration for the servant. A meeting he has worked and toiled lifelong² – knowingly or unknowingly – but now he meets Him, in one of two states. Either with awareness of the Haqq (Truth, and Right) of his Lord³, receives his complete reward and is elated. Or without awareness and moves from elation to desperation. "Behold! They are surely in doubt regarding their meeting with their Lord, behold! He surely over all things is all-Encompassing!" "So the one who keeps hoping for the Meeting with his Lord, must act righteously and not associate any partners in servitude alongside His Lord" When the Meeting materializes with the Absolute Perfection, the truest gladdening transpires; as the human has met the solution of his problems, the medicine of all his ills, the fullness for all his voids and the abundance for his abject poverty. Nothing else matters now... At this stage, the human sees nothing of himself, other than of Him, from Him and for Him.

<u>Reflection</u>: Why can the human not afford the non-acceptance of his apology accepted from His Lord? Discussion (with a scholar): What are ways for a wayfarer to prepare himself well for Liqā' 'Allāh?
